Nursing Research Paper - Literature Review

As the nurse leader in your future advanced practice track-based setting, you are committed to developing a culture of evidence-based nursing. How can you promote EBP to all nurses in your unit? Identify and review a minimum of 5 original nursing research articles.

The paper (excluding title page and reference pages) should be at least <u>NR 505</u> <u>Week 5</u> but no more than eight pages. Points will be lost if the paper exceeds this length requirement.

Identify and Review a Minimum of 5 Original Nursing Research Articles

A literature review is a critical component of a nursing research paper. It is a way of reviewing the existing literature on your topic, identifying gaps in the knowledge and answering questions that will lead you to further research.

You can search for articles by using various database tools, such as EBSCO and RefWorks. These databases allow you to create a search history, which makes it Research Summary Assignment to locate and retrieve articles later on.

Another type of source is a journal. There are many journals that publish original research articles on specific topics.

To find a good selection of research articles, use a search engine that specializes in health sciences. For example, PubMed(r) is a major database that contains more than 30 million citations from MEDLINE, life science journals and online books.

Organize and Summarize Your Literature Review

The literature review is the most important part of your project, as it synthesizes and organizes previous research on your topic. It should be logical and structured, keeping an objective perspective and using a formal voice.

Organize your literature review in one of two ways: chronologically or thematically.

A chronological review groups sources by <u>NR 505 Week 5 Research Summary</u> <u>Assignment</u> date and traces the history of your subject over time. This method is useful for papers that focus on historical analysis, research methodology, or historiographical writing.

A thematic review, on the other hand, is organized around a theme or central idea and discusses each source in relation to this theme. For example, you may want to examine how the portrayal of sperm whales in Moby Dick has changed over time.

Write a One-Page Summary of Your Literature Review

Literature reviews provide a brief overview of prior research in a particular field. They are often written as a section of a larger paper, such as a thesis or dissertation, and also serve as a stand-alone assignment.

When writing a literature review, you will need to carefully evaluate your sources and determine which ones are relevant to the topic and thesis of your paper. You will also <u>POLI 330N Week 2</u> to decide whether to summarize previous work or evaluate it in depth.

Typically, you will write a one-page summary of your literature review. This summary will include an introduction, body, and conclusions or recommendations.

Write a One-Page Summary of Your Findings

A one-page summary of your findings is the most efficient way to communicate the key points of a research paper. It should contain a brief description of the research (the who, what and why); the most important results and findings; and a recommendation for action that will be meaningful to your audience.

In order to write a good research summary, you should first scan your literature to identify the most important points and ideas. Next, prepare a point form outline. You should then edit the outline to eliminate secondary or minor points; use your judgment to keep the summary concise.

In the course of writing <u>coca cola implementation plan</u> one-page summary, you should also test the waters with a friend or colleague to see if they can read it without seeing a parent paper (respect any word count restrictions). For example, you could upload your article into SciSpace Copilot for an Al-generated summary of the most important points.
